Census of India 2011: Child sex ratio drops to lowest since Independence

NEW DELHI: Indicating a continuing preference for boys in society, the child sex ratio in India has dropped to 914 females against 1,000 males - the lowest since Independence - in the provisional 2011 Census report released today.

Despite a slew of laws to prevent female foeticide and schemes to encourage families to have girl child, the ratio has declined from 927 females against 1,000 males in 2001 to 914, which was described as a "matter of grave concern" by Census Commissioner of India C Chandramauli.

Surya Clinic's license is hanging by a thread

LICENSE of Suray clinic which was cancelled for excess abortions of women in the city about ten days ago will not be renewed by the district Health authorities, besides the district Health authorities have decided to take stern action against this clinic. The Health Department is not in a mood to give some relief to Surya Clinic in near future and there are remote chances of allowing this clinic to perform abortions.

Dr Pankaj Shukla, Chief Medical & Health Officer (CMHO) in a meeting of the senior doctors, took decision of not renewing license of Surya clinic. Such decision

was taken on the study report of clinic's documents that had incomplete information about the Medical Termination of Pregnancy (MTP) in the proformas prescribed by the Health Department.

À senior Government doctor said that Surya clinic doctors did not properly maintain MTP record and they had failed to tell the exact reasons of why doctors needed abortions of women in such large numbers. The clinic had more than 8000 abortions in It had performed an excessive of 8000 abortions in a year

The CMHO is understood to have decided to issue notices to those doctors who had referred women to this Clinic for abortions and if they fail to give proper reply, the recommendations to cancel their text Medical Council

registration with State Medical Council may be made.

Another decision taken in the meeting regarding Surya clinic was to count the birth of children aborted by the doctors. (Contd on page 2)
